Learners took part in a 2 minute silence in remembrance.

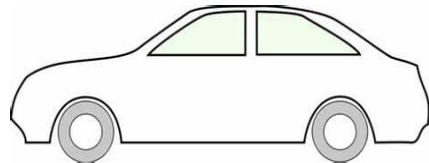

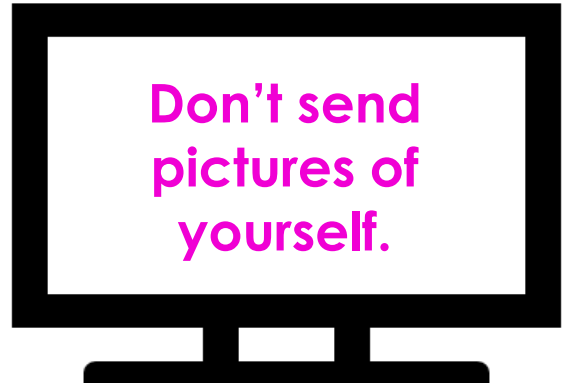


Learners learnt about E-Safety and discussed different ways to stay safe online.

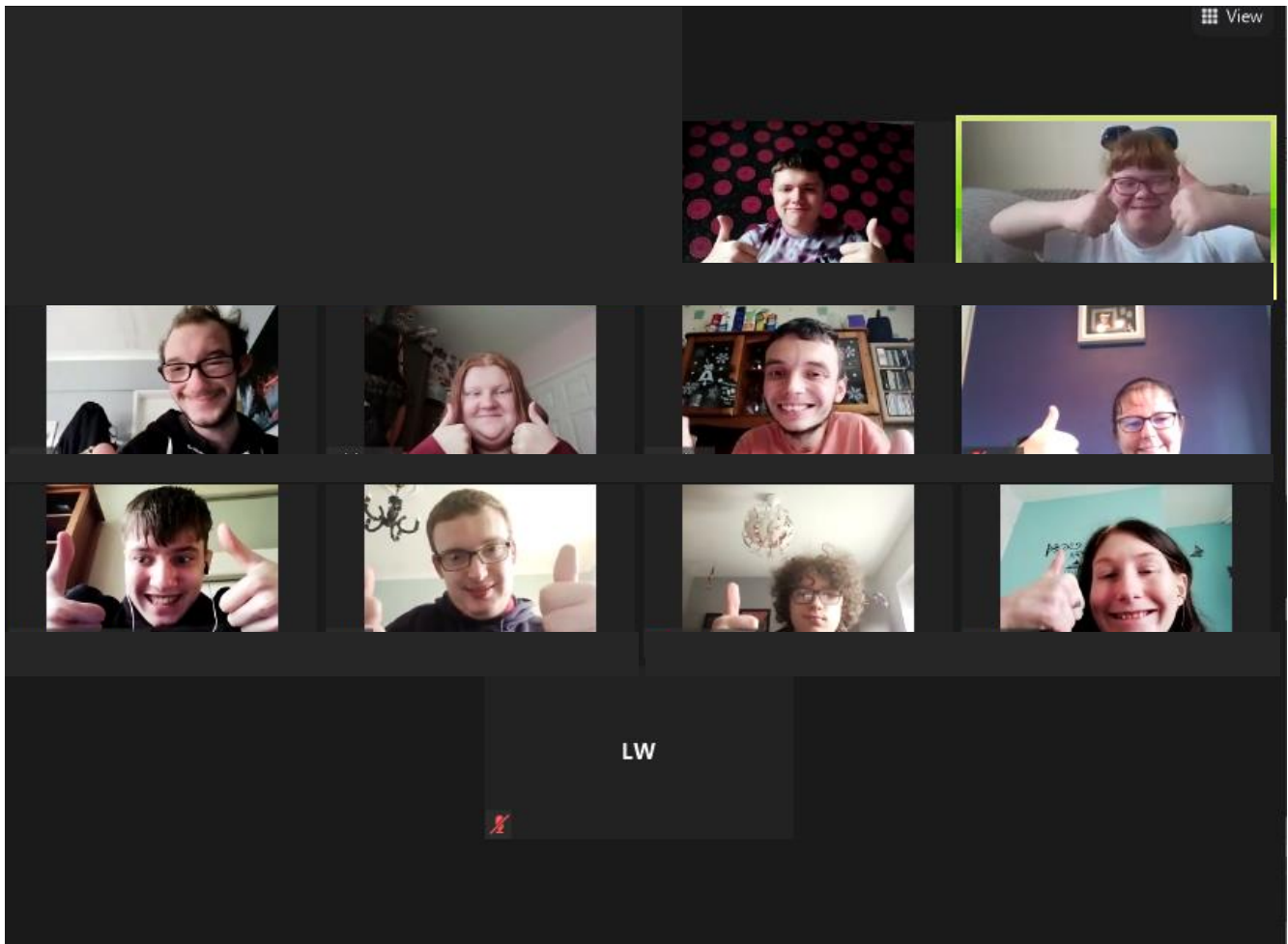
