DofE



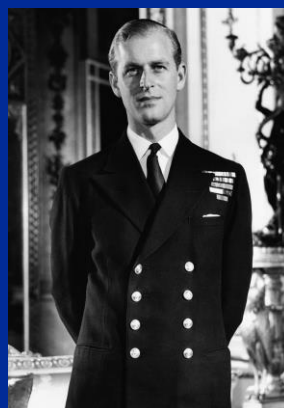
In memory of Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, Hub 1 have researched facts about his life and shared their own experiences of DofE.

In February, 1956 the Duke of Edinburgh awards was first announced. It was first for boys aged 15 – 18.



He was born in Corfu in 1921. The only son of Prince Andrew of Greece and Princess Alice of Battenburg.

The first Duke of Edinburgh awards ceremony was held in the United Kingdom in 1956.

CB - I like working as part of a team.

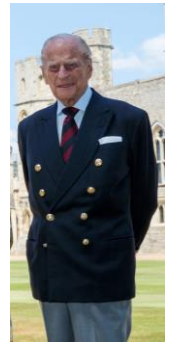
RS -

D of E award was founded in 1956.

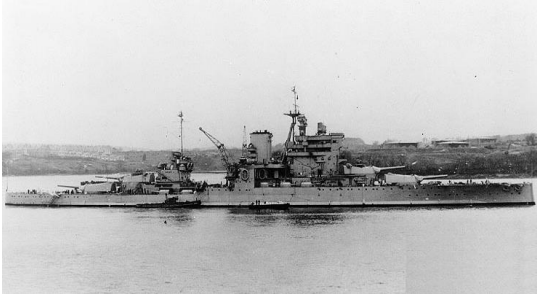
When was Prince Philip born?
He was born 10th June 1921 on the Greek Island of Corfu.



When did prince Philip get married?

His wedding to Queen Elizabeth II took place at Westminster Abbey on November 20th 1947.





What was Prince Philips occupation?

He had an eventful career in the Royal Navy.

Philip served aboard [HMS Valiant](#) in the [Battle of the Mediterranean](#).

How old was Prince Philip when he met Queen Elizabeth?

Prince Philip was 18 Years old and Queen Elizabeth II was only 13 years old. They met at his cousins wedding Princess Marina of Greece.



How many children does Prince Philip have?

Prince Philip has 4 children, Princess Anne, Prince Edward, Prince Andrew, Prince Charles. The Queen and Prince Philip have 8 Grandchildren and 10 great grand children.



Prince Philip actually gave up all of his Greek and Danish titles and adopted his mother's family name of "Mountbatten" to become a "naturalized" British subject. Only *then* did he become formally engaged to Elizabeth.



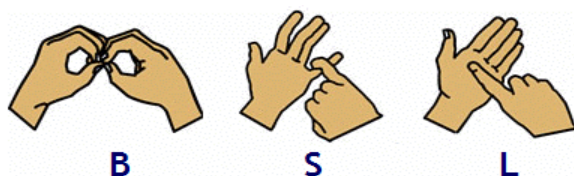
What was Prince Philip hobbies?

He enjoyed Carriage racing and polo.

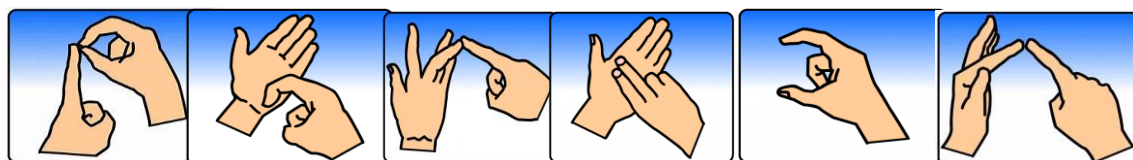
He died on the 9th April 2021. His emotional funeral took place at St George chapel Windsor, Saturday 17th April 2021. His coffin was lowered into the Royal Vault, where he will stay until the passing of Queen Elizabeth, then they will be laid to rest together at the gothic church's King George VI memorial chapel. It was the first televised Royal funeral service in history.



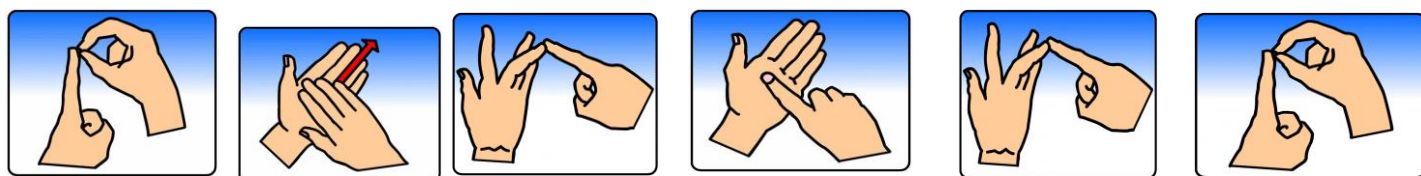
